Pupil Premium Funding Report and Impact

2019 - 2020

In 2019 to 2020 the school received money for 5 children based on the January 2019 school census. The Pupil Premium grant award was £5,580

In 2020 to 2021 the Pupil Premium fund is predicted to be based on 4 children

The Pupil Premium Grant is a sum of money allocated to schools to support children who are eligible for (or have been eligible for – in the last 6 years) Free School Meals, children who have a parent serving in the armed forces and children who have been in looked after care continuously for 6 months. The Pupil Premium for 2019-2020 was set at £1,320 per pupil and £300 for those pupils with a parent in the armed forces.

We use this funding to: provide inclusive opportunities; promote British Values, responsible attitudes and accountability; and support intervention where there are gaps in attainment or progress for children eligible for the funding.

Our current target is to maintain current progress in all year groups and provide speedy intervention where this target is not being met.
