HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear parents/carers,

Thank you if you attended Parents' Evening on Monday. As is always the case, it was a very high turnout and if you were unavailable, please do contact us to arrange an alternative date. This spring term has passed us by in somewhat of a blur but still the children have managed to pack so much in and continued to impress staff with their individual and collective endeavours. That was on display again today as they completed their Easter Egg Hunt in the school grounds. Thank you to our Friends' Group for arranging this. As a staff, we always look to acknowledge the pupils' efforts and that is why it is worthy of note now. Every member of the school community can not only recall our 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' approach to Rushbury but they very nearly always apply it in their work, play and general approach to school. That is what makes this school what it is.

In classes this week, Ticklerton have been designing and making moving monsters in DT; completed extended writing on single use plastic; designed a city map using symbols and a key; looked at stages of plant growth in Science and Reception completed Easter craft activities and all of the pupils welcomed some chicks to school earlier today. Gretton have tested soil samples in Science and learnt about scientific observation; they have begun work on scripts using the film 'Home, Sweet Home'; learnt about the resurrection of Jesus and its significance to Christians; covered volume and capacity in Maths and considered applying for jobs and what it means to be unemployed in the UK. Stanway have finished and delivered their Bookfest entries in four different categories... art, poetry, letter writing and filming. They have also completed portfolio writing on the topic of single use plastic; the alphabet in Spanish; and rounded off work on perimeter, area and capacity in Maths.

We also welcomed Revd. Lisa (also vice chair of our Governing Body) to school to join us for our Hereford Diocese Easter assembly on Wednesday and once more the children were very grateful for her kind donation of mini chocolate Easter eggs, on its conclusion.

Two more 'thank-yous' before finishing... to the parents and helpers who gave up a good few hours last weekend to lay the concrete base for our brand-new greenhouse (which will shortly be installed) and also to Alison and Peter for agreeing to provide our school kitchen with very tasty sausages from their Wenlock Edge Farm at such an affordable and competitive price.

I hope you have an enjoyable Easter break and we look forward to seeing the children back at school on **Monday, 13th April** for the start of the summer term.

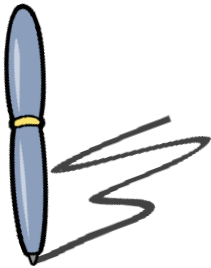

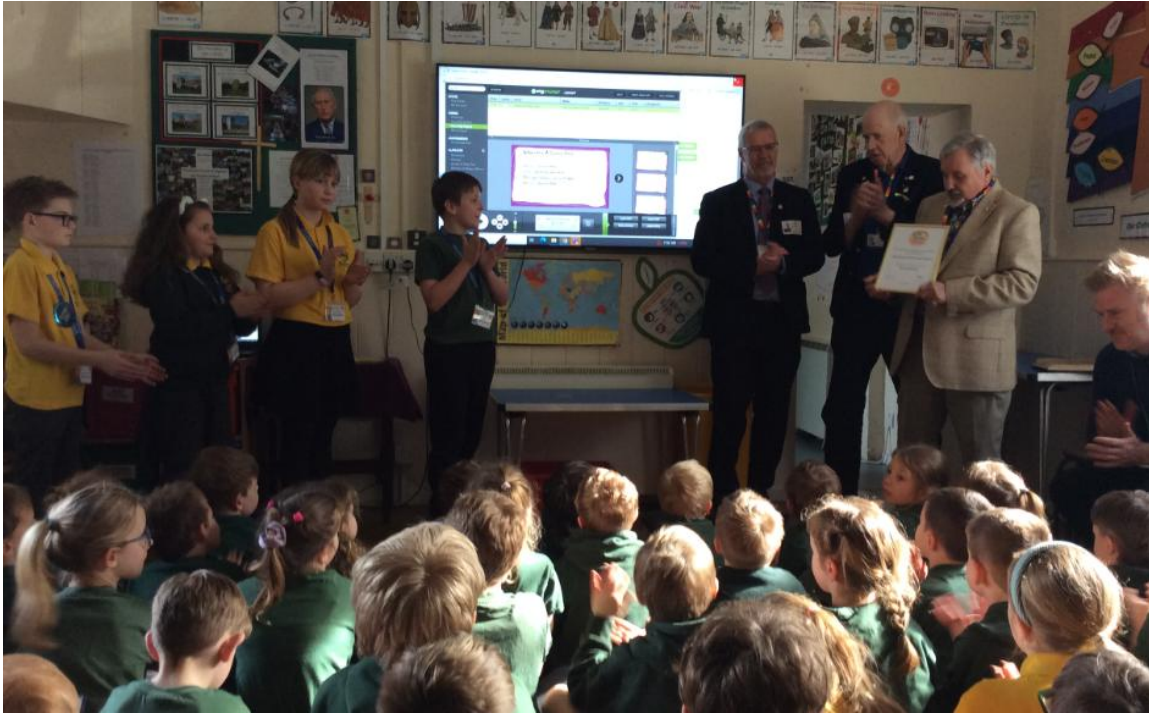

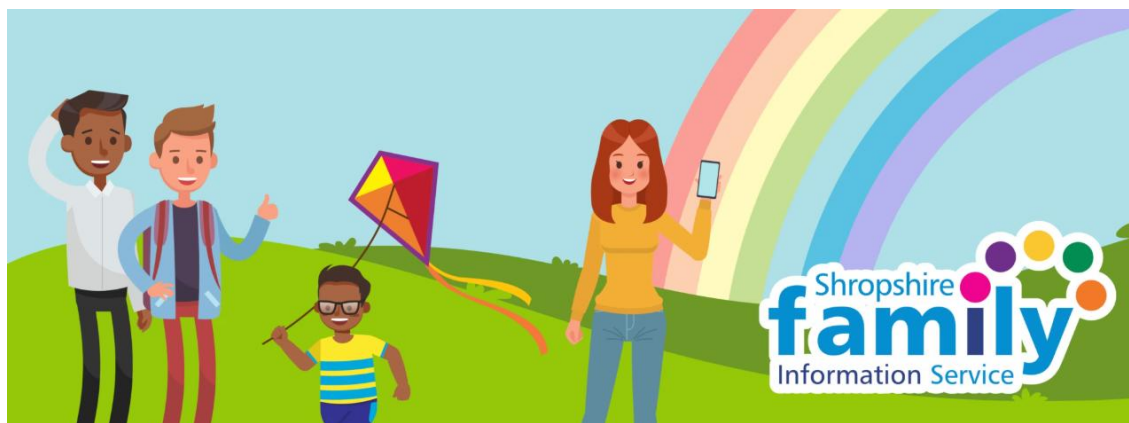
