Dear parents/carers,

I do hope you and your family enjoyed the uncharacteristically fantastic weather during half-term. Conditions this week have been more aligned to early June, which is no bad thing. Pupils have returned to school with typical enthusiasm and once again, very high attendance levels (see more detail on this later in the newsletter).

I know that the children from Gretton and Ticklerton classes had a brilliant day at Aberdovey just ahead of the half-term. Beach days are to be treasured and not every pupil is fortunate to benefit from one during the school summer holidays, making this type of excursion even more important.

Of course, Stanway headed to Liverpool for their residential. It was every bit as good as it was two years ago and all had a fantastic time. They visited... three museums, a Science activity centre, crossed the Mersey on a ferry, shopped in the city centre on both evenings, visited the Metropolitan Catholic Cathedral and Anglican Cathedral and perused the Albert Dock on an a leisurely evening walk. However, a highlight for almost all, was the surprise ride on the Liverpool Eye, affording amazing views in all directions. Some though, were less keen on being left at the top of the 'wheel' to enjoy the view for a good five minutes before returning to terra firma! In gloriously sunny conditions we enjoyed an ice cream on the Friday afternoon before heading back to Rushbury. Thank you to Miss Reeves for organising such a varied and exciting itinerary and thanks also to Mrs Hartley whose help was invaluable on the trip!

This week has started at a fair pace too. This second half of the summer term is always the most action-packed in a school calendar and there is so much more to do over the next six weeks. This week, Stanway Class completed their Bikeability training; groups of five or six pupils each completing a full day under close instruction. All the children impressed the instructors with their collective focus and ability to listen carefully and spot potential dangers on the road. Tuesday was also our first (out of 5), swimming session at Ludlow Leisure Centre. Miss Carter was pleasantly surprised with how water-confident our entire Reception cohort were. All were happy to get straight into the pool and submerge their heads under the water. I can imagine they'll be quite an impressive swimming cohort by the time they get to Year 6! On other sporting matters, I'm delighted to share with you that we have achieved **School Games Gold Status** for academic year '25-'26. This is an achievement the school is very proud of and recognition for the numerous sporting opportunities we offer our pupils and for their collective sporting commitment, in return.

Finally, our active School Council/Rotakids have been busy once again! Sophia and Darcie today, during assembly, completed a PowerPoint presentation on a fundraiser they would like the school to undertake. We will soon be embarking on a 'Toilet Twinning' mission. This will provide a community an opportunity to access a clean toilet and water, enabling children in far more deprived parts of the World to use toilets with dignity and most importantly, hygienically. This means they are far less likely to fall ill due to sanitation-related illnesses and for children it means they can then attend school more often. We will keep you up to date with this.

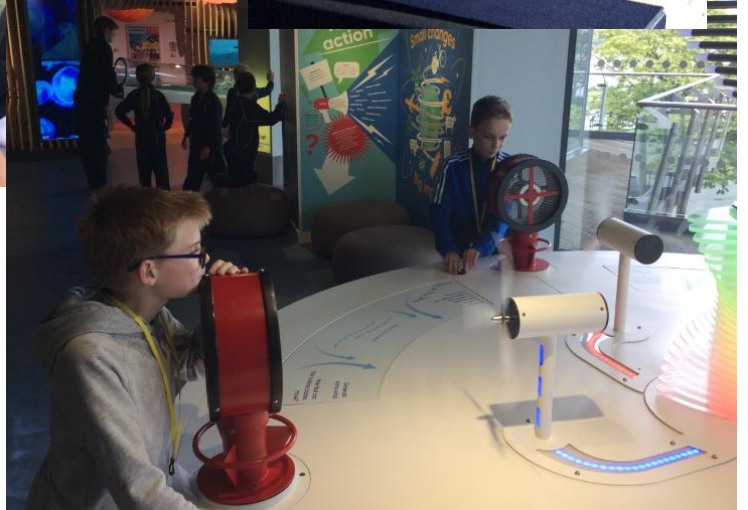
